This is a workshop especially for students on KEA's international programmes. The aim is to identify your competences for the job market. So, if you want to get ready to really demonstrate your capabilities for a coming employer, make sure to join.

The workshop content:

1. What qualities are recruiters looking for in Denmark?

We'll take a look at the cultural background for the flat management style. How does this influence the way you write a job application and the way you act at a job interview? How can you demonstrate that you're able to reflect and solve tasks independently and at the same time point out your positive qualifications without sounding too self-assertive? This is all about culture...

2. How to make your international background a competitive advantage

In this part of the workshop, you'll have an introduction to Danish companies' need for employees with international competences. On the basis of recent research, you'll be working on describing your own international competences so that people in business life will understand what they are. When you're able to put words on your "hidden international competences", you can put them in your CV and use them as preparation for future job interviews.

Throughout the workshop, we'll match theory with practice. You'll be actively engaged in formulating a part of your CV to make your personality shine and draw attention to your international competences. You can also try to pitch for a "job interview".

In conclusion, you will train to express your international competences in words and in a culturally intelligent way. This should make businesses understand how an international candidate can add extra value to their companies. This should make them see your hidden international competences!
