### STEPS BEFORE YOUR ARRIVAL





#### **Step 1 - Application**

- Online registration through a Google Form
- Online activation of personal Student Space
- Documents to send by email -l.martin@groupe-edh.com:
  - Copy of passport
  - ID picture
  - Copy of European health insurance card (for EU-students) only)





#### Step 2 - Admission letter and, if required, start of visa application



- Non-EU students: to apply for a student visa, please visit www.campusfrance.org. If your country doesn't follow the Campus France procedure, please contact the nearest French Consulate in your home country.
- EU students: you don't need a visa to study in France for 6 months unless you hold a special status of citizenship or residency in your home country.
- **Step 3 Accommodation application (see p.8)**
- **Step 4 Course selection**

Step 5 - Health insurance

All the international students must have health insurance during their studies with us.

- EU students: you need to request the European Health Insurance card and send us a copy before the start of the semester.
- Non EU-students: you will need to purchase the French health insurance by registration online upon arrival: http://etudiants-etranger.ameli.fr/#/



Most students are eligible for the CAF, a housing subsidy given by the French government. If you want to apply, we'll help you do it with you upon arrival. You'll need to bring your birth certificate translated into french, as the CAF will ask for it.



### Opening a bank account

In Bordeaux, the TBM is in charge of most of the public transportation.

The **TBM Pass Jeune** costs around 21€ per month and will allow you to use the tramway, bus, the BAT(a boat that'll allow you to go from one side of the river to another) and all the public bicycles.



Most banks open accounts easily for international students. You will have to prepare some documents:

- Copy of your ID card/passport
- Letter from your receiving institution stating you are a student
- A copy of your lease (if you are renting) or a statement written by the person housing you ("attestation d'hébergement" along with a copy of their ID and lease.

Groupe EDH has a partnership with La Société Générale Bank and we will help you open an account with them during Orientation.


