

IMC was about business strategies, work ethics, and in general how a company can communicate and form campaigns targeted their audience.

Digital transformation:

French language (Beginner):

French language, basics to start with but it gets hard very quickly in my experience. It is a great way to quickly learn basic sentences to use when you are in France.

French Culture:

Cultural insights in French culture, learn about ethics, history, Wine & Cheese. In this course we went on trips as much as possible with the corona restrictions, we got to see alot of french culture and understand the background. So a very interesting course if you care about culture.

For example what is ethically correct.

Very case based course with scenarios from real campaigns that for some reason have had controversy connected to them and why.

Work out fashion campaigns and learn to understand how colours have meanings and how fashion brands think when they launch new products.

Academic Experience

1. How helpful was the receiving school in the process of choosing classes and settling you in?

The process of choosing classes was alright but we got to know very late. Also since 30etc points is a requirement from KEA, I had to pick all the courses anyways.

The school did a practical day the first day and were in dialog with each of us throug the whole stay. In other words they were very helpful and fast at replying to our emails.

Dont be intimidated by the french to easily they are very kind and polite people, but they will let you know how they feel and dont hold back in that way. They can be very expressive.

Try to speak french when you can, even just saying Bonjour or bon soir, goes such a long way in the heart of the french.

They love to see you trying!

I often experianced the french when I asked them

"Bonjour monsuer parle vous angle?" – Hello mr do you speak english? they will say "little" with a really french accent.

But then usually they are actually quite decent at it.

If you on the other hand ask, "Do you speak english" you are more likely to hear them say "No" in a super french way.

Practical Experience

- 1. How was the application process?
 - a. What did KEA help you with?

KEA helped me to get a overview of my options, and have helped in every step of the application process. I found Hanne to be really good at communicating with me about the process and what I should do to complete my application etc.

b. What help did you receive from your school abroad? They mostly sent out the information, and then it was up to me. But I could just ask if I had any questions.

2. Did you have any practical difficulties settling down in at your destination?

Besides big bags and tired legs it went pretty smooth arriving in Paris. Their metro network is amazing and can get you anywhere in a short time. Culturally it is something you need to get used to but I think that depends how you look at it.

a. How helpful was the receiving school in this process? The school offered some study residence but it was not relevant for me since I did not like those rooms and they were overpriced aswell.

3. Where did you live?

I lived just outside Paris in a area called La garenne colombes, its placed just next to La defense.

a. Was it difficult to find accommodation?

Yes it was hard to find a place to live, I started in good time but I did not find a place before I was in Paris already.

Its a jungle out there and you need to be ready to refresh facebook pages and other appartments sites many times. Be aware of scammers, they are very common and can be hard to spot. Thats why its good to be there before doing any final deals or transfering money.

b. Was it expensive?

It really depends but yes it is expensive to live in Paris, I chose to stay abit outside the city in a place with good connections, so I could get a more local view and not be in the chaos of the city all the time, it took me just 10 min with train and about 25 by bike so it was not a problem really.

This also meant that I could get a nice big apartment for the same price as a single room in a shared apartment mid city.

- 4. What kind of expenses did you have in general?
 - I had expenses for **apartment**, food, experiences(Resturants etc) and transport. If you want to explore the city alot it can quickly bump up your expenses, I bought 2 bikes just when I arrived, this cost me 80€ total about the same as 1 month of train card (Which is cheaper than individual tickets) So this was a good option for me. My girlfriend and I could go with the bike sometimes but other times its better with public transport if its a long day in the city.
- 5. a. Did you spend more or less money than you budgeted with?

Less because of Corona restrictions and because I got a good deal on housing + Bike. (Be prepared tho since Paris is quite expensive)
