International business techniques - taught by great speaker Ing. I understand that this subject is more theoretic but it connects well with the others and you always need to know the theory first to use it in practical measure

International Marketing - taught by very interesting teacher Ing. Hayad who may sound strange at the beginning but he is great teacher who knows a lot about current trends in marketing and will explain it to you as you will be ready to jump into the field after his classes

Principles of World Economy - again taught by Mgr. Šípková and in this subject who will learn a discuss current but also past situations in the world economy, its struggles, globalization and regional principles which puts the image of the local situation into greater perspective

International trade 3 - taught by amazing doc. Ing. Fialová who herself publishes books about the business cycle which is the topic of this subject. You will get the knowledge about the territorial and market business cycle and an opportunity to choose your own market and territory to present and discuss in class

European Region - Comparison of Economics - last but not least, my favourite one, taught by incredible speaker and former economic advisor (among others) of first Czech republic president Václav Havel, PhDr. Tomáš Sedláček. In the subject you will pick up the part of Europe and you will together with your classmate present positive and negative point of view on the region or the topic and afterwards, you will in open discussion with the teacher and your classmates emphasis on the problem and learn through the discussion and comments by the teacher about the European economy and many more. Personally, this subject was the best among other great ones and I highly recommend you to take it. And don't forget to say "Hi" from me to the teacher when you will introduce yourself in the first class

I can't tell you much about the housing as I was doing the online lessons from my home in Prague, but what I know from Mgr. Berouskova, it is not a problem to find it, receiving school will help you with it and prices are very friendly compared to Denmark.
