What classes did you take during your semester abroad?

Managing by Design – Here we learned about new theories and methods to get data and use the data you have collected from your desktop research and interviews.

Managing emerging technologies – This class was about new technologies and how they were working and what impact they had. So, we learned a lot about new technologies and how they got to where they are today.

Mobile App Management – Here we learnt how so basically manage an app, how to advertise it and what that is important to keep in mind when making an app. We even made our own little app as our final project.

Digital Analytics – In Digital Analytics we worked with different companies and analyzed their websites and came up with plans to help them grow their website and get more traffic and sales on their website.

Management IT and Information Systems I (MITS I) – here we learned about IT and different information systems like CRM, ERP and SCM which can help grow a company, but we also learned about BI and AI as that can also help a company grow.

Academic Experience

How helpful was the receiving school in the process of choosing classes and settling you in?

They were helpful whenever I had any questions, I could just email my coordinator at the university, and she would help. For settling in with the others we had an introduction the first day and after that we found our friend groups quick and after we started with our classes, we also found out more new friends both from Erasmus but also the other students at La Salle.

What classes/study experiences did you find the most rewarding? Why?

I found the best study experiences was when you got to work with Spanish companies. A bit like what we do at KEA. I enjoyed working with the companies and learn about them as you got to learn more about how it is to have a business in Spain.

What classes/study experiences did you find least relevant or least valuable to you? Why?

Cultural/Personal Experience

What challenges did you experience culturally while being abroad?
