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Introduction

Studying abroad is an exciting opportunity for students to broaden their horizons, learn about new cultures and gain valuable educational experiences. I got the opportunity to study abroad in Santander, Spain at Cesine during September 2022 to January 2023. I am studying the Business, Economics, and IT program at the international class in KEA. I would advise them to choose audiovisual, as it was the most creative and fun class I had. I wouldn't recommend taking both social media and digital marketing, as they are almost the same.

A little bit, but I was also late with the searching. I didn't find one until 2 weeks before the semester started.

b. Was it expensive?

Not at all, I paid around 250€ a month then I had my own room and lived with 3 other girls though.

4. What kind of expenses did you have in general? Mostly food and transport. We did a lot of trips which was probably what I spent the most money on. But everything was very cheap compared to Denmark. a. Did you spend more or less money than you budgeted with? I didn't really make a budget, but I would say that Santander was cheaper than I expected it to be!
