Exchange Report

1. Where and when did you study abroad?

I studied at George Brown College in Toronto, Canada in the Spring 2023 semester.

2. What KEA program did you attend at the time?

I attended the Computer Science Program at KEA and the T227 Computer Programmer Analyst program in the receiving institution.

3. What classes did you take during your semester abroad?

I attended four courses at George Brown College.

Intro to Cybersecurity: We learned the fundamentals of cybersecurity. We learned how to secure web applications from threats and different attacking techniques. We also learned about the different cyber-attacks and how to prevent those. We also used a little php in this course.

Intro to Full Stack Development: We learned the fundamentals of frontend and backend programming. The focus was on JavaScript, HTML and CSS. We learned about different functions in JavaScript, JSON, and API.

Object Oriented Programming: We learned to code in C#. We learned about all the OOP principles in C# such as array lists, classes, methods, access modifiers etc.

Web Application Development: We learned to code web applications with C# and ASP.NET framework. We learned about MVC (Model-View-Controller), connecting databases to your project, and finally hosting it.

Academic Experience

1. How helpful was the receiving school in the process of choosing classes and settling you in?

The receiving school was very helpful with every question and concern I had regarding courses, first day at the school and navigating around in general.

2. What classes/study experiences did you find the most rewarding? Why?

I found the Intro to Full Stack Development course very rewarding. I had the best professor who only had student's best interest at heart. She clarified every new concept that we learned and taught it a way so that you could understand. It was very motivating.

If cybersecurity is interesting to you, then I can recommend the Intro. To Cybersecurity course. The professor knows what he is doing and has a lot of knowledge.

I wouldn't recommend the Object-Oriented Programming Course in C#, if you already have knowledge in other OOP languages.
