


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
INTRODUCTION

Experience at Host University

MDCM 206 New Media Writing

In this course, students develop a critical understanding of the communications needs of an organization and the content needs of its website. They learn to write for specific audiences through specific media, including corporate websites and social media. The students begin work on producing promotional or informational video proposals for corporate or not-for-profit organizations. They research, write, and edit news releases and backgrounder sheets, and produce pitch letters for mainstream as well as alternative media, both print and online.

As well, they may write short feature pieces for online trade magazines, newsletters or a venue of their choosing. Students also research, write, and edit brochures and e-blasts. They adapt print material for the web, demonstrating their understanding of information architecture by repeating strong keywords in heads, leads, and photo captions; producing sidebars; writing eye-catching sub-heads; and incorporating hypertext into their work. They also produce writing for spoken delivery, such a speeches and introductions. Throughout, they adhere to the requirements of all good writing: proper grammar and syntax, supported opinion, verifiable fact, thorough research, and engaging voice.

Teaching methods:

Methods used in this subject were primarily for writing and different strategies for target groups and publication. Furthermore we used In-design for making a brochure.

Christina Batty was the teacher, and she was very helpful and always prepared. She delivered helpful feedback on every assignment.

What I learned:

I learned to create writing content for different medias. I learned to make a PR kit, what it contained and to write to the concrete target publications. I learned to use correct PR requirements.

MDCM 253 Advanced Design

Successful design comes from the implementation of a clear development plan based on a solid understanding of a client's needs. Achieving the design outcomes of any given project requires that the graphic designer recognize the trends of the industry while remaining relevant within the changing world of design. To this end, students delve further into the use of the industry-standard software and the tools of the design trade to which they were introduced in the prerequisite MDCM 230 Digital Design. This course explores best practice and procedures used in creating computer-generated designs using Illustrator, InDesign and Photoshop.

Teaching methods:

In this subject we used Photoshop, Illustrator and primarily In-design. We learned how the different programs interact with each other. Design principles were taught.

The teacher in Advanced Design was Judy Wood. She provided great knowledge in design principles and in the different programs.

What I learned:

I learned how to use the programs to its fullest. Furthermore I learned how to make design for different medias and a magazine spread.

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MMDD 225 Building Dynamic Web Pages

In this project-driven course, students examine how to integrate dynamic content into web pages. Topics include JavaScript and server side scripting using PHP. Students cover the basics of database design. By the end of this course, students have a minimum of three portfolio examples that demonstrate an ability to work with dynamic web content technologies. Students also maintain a web-based learning journal.

Teaching methods:

Methods used in this subject were JavaScript, PHP and Database. We used Dreamweaver. The teacher was bad and new to the school.

What I learned:

I've learned very little in this class, since the teacher was not helpful and prepared way to much for each lesson.

RBD 225 0NA Media Branding

Focusing on content creation for the digital space, Media Branding teaches students how to effectively construct and design digital broad-cast media content. Elements explored include podcasting, photo and video composition and creation, simple photo manipulation, and proper writing techniques.

Teaching methods:

Theories about how to use SOME, and target groups etc. We used podcast production elements, video and writing skills for blogs. The teacher was Pina Crispo, she had good knowledge in the field and had many contacts in the Radio world.

What I learned:

I learned some about branding for a company. But it was all about radio, which was not my field.

WEBD 221 Web Programming 3

With a foundation in HTML and CSS, students are now ready to dive in deeper into web programming. This course goes into detail on responsive design, use of pre-processor tools and PHP. Through a series of hands-on exercises, students will learn how to create dynamic web pages.

Teaching methods:

Methods used in this class were HTML, CSS, JavaScript and PHP. We used MAMP and brackets to the coding.

What I learned:


I learned an extension of coding and how PHP is used to interact with the other coding systems.






PRACTICAL EXPERIENCES
