
I devoted myself into developing my creative abilities and improve my craftmanship within design and art, I choose to take all the creative hands-on classes that they could offer me.




STUDIO I & II

Studio course is dedicated to the pursuit of individual expression of the designthesis, synthesize design knowledge and skills to create a collection of work with a sharp design focus. You are expected to demonstrate sophisticated design decisions and thoughtful design solutions that exemplify a high level of expertise and achievement.

After the design development, it's required to be able to construct and sew a whole outfit every week, it's a tough and independent study with a lot of deadlines. By the end of the class, you must be done with 3 ready-to-wear outfits with accessories that compliment your collection to make a photoshoot. I will compare this course with the tv-program project runway.

My professor Shaun Samson senior Designer at Moschino taught me how to push my own creativity further, to continuously create and reflect on my own designs. Having the opportunity to step into his universe and see his work at Moschino continued to inspire me. I'm honored to have had him as my professor and mentor.

CULTURAL/PERSONAL EXPERIENCE





PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE

The application process is long, difficult and time consuming. Make sure to read everything you can beforehand. Be aware of the visa application, the faster you can get all the required documents ready to the embassy will save yourself time at the end. Be prepared to pay to a lot of things you don't necessary fully understand. The US do things in the old fashion way, so be patience and let your advisor know where you are in the process, check your email daily and be quick to response.

Due to the covid situation my process was uncertain all the way to the end. It's a stressful period and you must do it while studying, so be prepared to use all your spare time on that.


HOUSING

At FIDM they offer student housing, you will share a apartment and your roomies will be fellow students. It's a easy process and the resident advisor will guide you through the process.

I lived in a full serviced apartment called Broadway palace apartments in Downton LA 5 minutes' walk from the school. I enjoyed living there and I was a heavy user of the gym and rooftop pool!

Housing and living expenses are similar to Denmark, even a little bit more expensive. Depending on how elaborate your lifestyle is you'r goanna at least need 100.000 DKK KR to housing, plaine tickets, insurance, phone bills, food, transportation and the required payment for student supplies every quarter. I couldn't drive so UBER was an expense I forgot to count in.
